## Alfred <u>John</u> Gardyne Drummond de Chastelain, CC, CMM, CStJ, CD, CH Chief of the Defence Staff 08 September 1989 - 29 January 1993 01 January 1994 - 31 December 1995

He served as the Chief of the Defence Staff on two occasions. He was appointed as the Ambassador to the USA in February 1993 by the Prime Minister Brian Mulroney. He was transferred to the Calgary Highlanders of Canada where he had joined in 1956 on their retired list. When Jean Chretien became Prime Minister later that year, he wanted his nephew to become the Ambassador to the USA. He therefore offered General de Chastelain the position of Chief of Defence Staff of the Canadian Armed Forces but as a civilian. De Chastelain didn't want that but he was now overage to be CDS in uniform. This was gotten around by having him become an active member of the Calgary Highlanders and attach posting him to Ottawa as the CDS. Then they had to find something for Admiral John Anderson who was being displaced as the CDS and they made him the Permanent Representative and Ambassador to to NATO Headquarters in Brussels.
