On January 2009, an Israeli tank shelled the home of Dr. Izzeldin Abuelaish in the Gaza Strip killing three of his daughters, Bessan, 21, Mayar, 15, and Aya, 13. That heartbreaking tragedy came minutes before Dr. Abuelaish spoke live on an Israeli TV program. His anguished cries for help captured hearts and headlines in Israel and around the world. It was Abuelaish's response to the loss of his daughters that won him humanitarian awards around the world. Instead of seeking revenge or sinking into despair and



hatred, Dr. Abuelaish has called for the people of the Middle East to stop the bloodshed and start talking to each other. His deepest hope is that his daughters will be the last sacrifice on the road to peace between Palestinians and Israelis. The Daughters for Life Foundation was established in memory of Bessan, Mayar and Aya and seeks to honour their love of life and learning and their hopes and dreams for an educated future.

Charlene Belleau is a member of the Esketemc First Nation (also known as Alkali Lake) in the interior of British Columbia. She was the first female Chief from 1985 to 1987 and a Senior Negotiator and Treaty Manager from 1997 to 2003. In 2005 she was the Manager of the Indian Residential Schools Unit of the Assembly of First Nations. She returned to serve an additional term as Chief and has since returned to the Assembly of First Nations.

She co-produced a three-part documentary The Honor of One is the Honor of All - The Story of Alkali Lake as well as assisted with residential school documentaries for CBC, NBC and APTN. She has served on various local, regional, provincial and national organizations as a Board of Director or committee member, including the Aboriginal Healing Foundation, Provincial Child Welfare Committee, Provincial Native Advisory Committee on Sexual Abuse, Provincial Advisory Committee on Substance Abuse, Provincial Health Council, President-Nenqayni Treatment Centre Society. She has delivered numerous keynote addresses on residential school issues in Canada, the United States, Germany and Australia. She is a residential school Survivor and has

been an advocate for Survivors since her community's residential school closed in 1981.



"Angèle and André Gingras founded SOPAR - Bala Vikasa, an international development organization dedicated to improving the living conditions of people in India's rural communities. Through a range of personal and community development programs, SOPAR - Bala Vikasa has helped millions of people reach their full potential and become agents of social change in their communities."

Bala Theresa Singareddy (Angèle) was born in Reddipalem, a village in the state of Telangana in India. During her youth, she studied in India, in the United States and in the Philippines. While in the Philippines, she met a Canadian – André Gingras – whom she married. In 1975, in their hometown of Limbour, Gatineau, Québec, they began to raise awareness amongst their friends and neighbors about the living conditions of people in India. These discussions led to the formation of a small group, "Partage Reddipalem", dedicated to sponsoring the education of poor children in India. In 1977, SOPAR was founded.

For the first 13 years of its existence, Angèle managed SOPAR as a volunteer from her own home. In 1990, she left for India with her husband who, after a 25-year career with the Canadian International Development Agency, took one last overseas posting. In India, Angèle devoted her time to creating a new organization – Bala Vikasa – aimed at ensuring the effective implementation of SOPAR's programs in India. In 1991, Bala Vikasa became a registered NGO with the Indian government. Since then, the two sister organizations have pursued a common objective: to support the development process of rural Indian communities. As a result of their vision, dedication and familiarity with the reality of India's rural areas, the founders were able to establish a model organization that has changed the lives of hundreds of thousands of people.



A member of numerous boards and national think-tanks, she has had a positive impact on the quality of life and economic well-being of Indigenous peoples within her community and across the country."

Dawn Madahbee Leach has been the General Manager for the Waubetek Business Development Corporation since 1988. Waubetek is a leading Aboriginal Financial Institution that provides financial services to Indigenous entrepreneurs and 27 First Nations in Northeastern Ontario. She is the first Indigenous woman in Canada to head up a regional financial lending institution. At Waubetek, Ms. Madahbee Leach was instrumental in the establishment of major community development projects as well as a \$70 million investment in Indigenous businesses who experience a business success rate at 94%. Nationally, she has helped design programs that meet the capital needs for Indigenous businesses and First Nation communities. Ms. Madahbee Leach also currently serves on the Boards of Peace Hills Trust, the Northern Policy Institute and the North-East Local Health Integration Network. She has also served on her First Nation



Council and was the former Chairperson of the Northern Ontario Development Corporation and a former director for both the Ontario Development Corporation and Innovations Ontario Corporation. She has spoken and promoted Indigenous businesses internationally in regions such as Australia, Germany, the United States and the United Kingdom. Ms. Madahbee Leach is the owner of Indigenous Business International, a company that provides consulting services and promotes corporate partnerships with Indigenous people.

In 2004, she was recognized as a *Mover and Shaker* for economic development in Northern Ontario Business. Ms. Madahbee Leach was contributed a chapter in the book "Changing Lives: Women of Northern Ontario". She also contributed to a book compilation entitled "Governance in Northern Ontario — Economic Development and Policy-Making" by Segsworth and Conteh with her chapter "First Nations Inclusion: A Key Requirement to Building the Northern Ontario Economy". She is a hard-working

community member and partakes in a number of volunteer activities. Among her many volunteer commitments, she has sat on the Board of Directors for a regional women's shelter and has participated in the fundraising for the Ojibwe Cultural Foundation's capital campaign. Ms. Madahbee Leach graduated from the University of Waterloo's Economic Development Program and holds a degree in Political Science and Law from York and Laurentian Universities.

After moving to NATO HQ in Brussels from Norfolk, Virginia, where she was an analyst working for the Supreme Allied Commander Transformation (SACT), Ms. Pond became an important advocate and champion for the destruction of land mines and surplus weapons which otherwise might have harmed civilian populations as well as NATO forces. Starting with seed money from the couple's retirement fund, this dedicated family inspired an outpouring of generosity from their home community of Lindsay and the Tibetan diaspora in North America. Their efforts have raised the standard of living and a community's hopes halfway around the world."

व्यय्विया machik

In Tibetan, Machik means "one mother" and was also the epithet of Machik Lapdron, an 11th century Tibetan female innovator who developed the practice of Chod. This evocative name embodies the values of compassionate commitment to grassroots communities, using innovative approaches to tackling age-old problems, and the desire to build an engaged global conversation about Tibet, all of which are central to how we approach this work.

Born in a Tibetan refugee settlement in India and raised in Canada, Dr. Losang Rabgey holds a Ph.D. from the University of London and is the first Tibetan to hold a graduate degree in feminist anthropology. Rabgey is also the first Tibetan Commonwealth Scholar and National Geographic Explorer. In 1998, she and her sister, Dr. Tashi Rabgey, co-founded Machik, a non-profit whose mission is to grow a global community of care for a stronger future for Tibet. In the last two decades, Machik has supported education for thousands of rural youth in Tibet and the diaspora. The organization has also supported Tibetan change-makers in Tibet—particularly in rural communities—who work in education, film, gender equity, conservation, and HIV/AIDS awareness. Gender


equity has always been a key focus of Machik's work through programs like the Mother's Wish Foundation—providing support for women's higher education—and the Machik Gender Summit. Dr. Rabgey and her sister have been named by Harvard Law School as "Women Inspiring Change," a recognition which has included—among others—Stacey Abrams, Justice Sonia Sotomayor, and Kamala Harris. Dr. Rabgey and her family were recently honored with the Meritorious Service Cross by the Governor-General of Canada. A frequent public speaker, Dr. Rabgey has presented at Yale University, Harvard University, UC Santa Cruz, and the Nobel Peace Forum, among many others. Rabgey first traveled to Tibet with her family in 1987.

Richard H. Gimblett is a historian and policy analyst who served for nearly three decades in the Canadian Navy as a surface operations officer. He has written several historical books about the Canadian military, covering such diverse times and wars as World War I and the Persian Gulf War in 1991. For his first book, *Operation Friction*, 1990-1991: The Canadian Forces in the Persian Gulf, the author collaborates with Jean H. Morin to tell of the Canadian military's contribution to this war with Iraq. The author was Combat Officer of the Canadian ship HMCS *Protecteur* for operations in the Persian Gulf. He serves as a Maritime Staff Officer Heritage, Command Historian, at National Defence Headquarters.
