On 10 July 2017, and Howlett and the rest of the *Shelagh* crew were racing to save North Atlantic right whale No. 4123. After finding the whale, the Fisheries and Oceans boat they had switched to approached the animal slowly. On his first pass, Howlett was able to cut one line. In only 15 minutes and two masterful cuts, No. 4123 was free. As the whale propelled itself down into the sea, Howlett had to duck as the tail came up. The dorsal side of the whale's tail flip into the bow of the boat as it was going down hitting Howlett with roughly a tonne of force. Howlett was killed instantly.

Her initiative precipitated a rescue plan that helped 422 of these rescue workers escape from Syria through the Golan Heights to Jordan, then on to Canada and other safe countries. The event demonstrated our nation's humanitarianism to the world and its commitment to protecting partner organizations in conflict areas."

She is the representative of Canada in West Bank/Gaza & former Special Representative for Syria.

The bankers, barbers and ordinary citizens in Syria made up the White Helmets, who, over Syria's seven-year civil war, were the volunteer rescue



workers who had braved barrel bombing and chemical attacks to save more than 114,000 citizens who dared oppose President Bashar al-Assad. Singled out for torture and death by the regime, their lives were now in danger. With the assistance of Canadian Ambassador Peter MacDougall, Canadian Foreign Affairs Minister Chrystia Freeland and Robin Wettlauffer, messages via phone calls, WhatsApp messaged, and codes emails went out to the White Helmets that they were in danger. The regime's advancing army had closed off the border to Jordan, leaving the Golan Heights as the only crossing point available, which meant Israel had to agree to let them in. Jordan had to sign off on receiving the rescued men, women and children from Israel, even if only for a short stay. Buses to take the White Helmets from Israel to Jordan had to be organized. Meanwhile, Assad's regime was closing off access routes from the south to the Israeli border. And, as if the stars refused to align, ISIS started its own scrap for a piece of land that cut off access from the south.

The Mayday Rescue team sent a coded message by text and WhatsApp to the White Helmets: Head to the border with Israel. The instruction seemed counterintuitive — Israel was an enemy border. But it was the only option available, so the first responders began moving from dozens of locations toward the Golan Heights. Shortly after 9 p.m. on July 21, 2018, the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) gave the order: "Now." The metal gate separating the two enemy countries cranked open. That night, 422 lives were saved.





"Grégory Sadetsky played a pivotal role in developing emergency call location software that enabled the U.S. Coast Guard and Texas first responders to coordinate their evacuation efforts in response to Hurricane Harvey in 2017. This software, which subsequently proved successful during hurricanes Florence and Michael, has become an invaluable public safety tool."



David Hein and Irene Sankoff are the creators of *Come From Away*, the wildly successful Broadway musical based on the story of airline passengers who were stranded in Gander following the terror attacks of September 11, 2001. Michael Rubinoff, artistic director and founder of the Canadian Music Theatre Project at Sheridan College, is one of the



producers. He proposed the concept of a musical based on those events, which was then brilliantly written by Mr. Hein and Ms. Sankoff. The production has shone a light on the Newfoundlanders' hospitality, and has shared with the world a little-known tale of kindness and generosity in the face of overwhelming tragedy.



He led successful Charter challenges on citizenship and equal rights on behalf of women, children, war brides, veterans, Chinese and Indigenous peoples. He continues to advocate changes to out-of-date federal legislation."

"The Lost Canadians" detailing how he lost his Canadian citizenship and fought to get it back for himself and for others.

When Vancouver-born Don Chapman was six years old, he was stripped of his Canadian citizenship, thanks to an arcane provision of the 1947 Canadian Citizenship Act. Years later, he was stunned to discover that he couldn't return to his homeland, and thus began his David and Goliath battle to change Canada's discriminatory citizenship laws. He's since become the voice for hundreds of thousands of others like himself, now collectively known as the Lost Canadians, whose ranks have included such Canadian icons as Roméo Dallaire, Guy Lombardo, Leslie Nielsen, Ricky Gervais, and Nobel Prize winners Willard Boyle and Saul Bellow. Children born on military bases overseas were affected, as were tens of thousands of Second World War brides and their children. Perhaps the most stunning of all: Canada doesn't recognize some living Second World War veterans as citizens.

Ruth James, a retired schoolteacher Ruth put her talents to good use when she joined the board of directors of The African Children's Book Box Society. The African Children's Book Box Society was founded in Nairobi, Kenya in 1991. Their main purpose is to support and increase literacy in Africa by providing children with their own stories and literature written by African authors. They do this by putting together and distributing portable libraries of African books in the form of "Book Boxes" to African schools.

Aside from her fundraising activities in Canada, Ruth and her friend Anne Pearson (also a retired teacher and director of the charity) visit Tanzania each spring to work on projects there. They spearheaded the construction and equipping of a school library for a remote village school and have several other educational and aid projects in the works as well. One of their latest efforts is the launch of a school lunch program for the impoverished and hungry children who attend that school.

She wrote a book called "A Little Elephant, Brave". While written to create African literature for African children, the book's relevance is universal.



Anne Pearson started the African Children's Book Box society in Kenya in 1990 when she discovered a need for locally written and published books in local schools. Over the past 15 years ABB has expanded to Tanzania where it supports a diversity of education and health initiatives.
