1846	Lieutenant	58 th Foot to New Zealand; MID for capture of Stronghold of Maori Chief Kawiti
1846	Lieutenant	2 nd MID in New Zealand for helping to Repel a Maori attack on Wanganui

06/07/1852	Captain	96 th Foot, India – Passed Examination in Surveying
1855	Captain	96 th Foot Commanded a troop of Cavalry suppression of the Santāl rebellion

06/1857	Captain	Calcutta, Indian Mutiny – recommended for Victoria Cross
20/07/1858	Brevet Major	Lord Clyde ruled Staff Officers don't get the V.C. – Brevet Major his reward

1861	Brevet Major	Gibraltar and Mala
1863	Brevet Major	1 st Class Certificate at the School of Musketry at Hythe, Kent
12/1866	Brevet Major	Staff College, Camberley
07/1867	Brevet Major	29 th Foot to Camberley – However still at Staff College
08/1868	LCol	Joins 29 th Foot in Canada in Hamilton, Ontario
04/1869	LCol	On Half Pay – Town Major in London
08/1869	LCol	On Half Pay – Acting Assistant Quartermaster General in Montreal
1870	LCol	On Half Pay – Temporary deputy adjutant and quartermaster general
1870	LCol	To England – Full Pay as Superintending officer of garrison instruction
08/09/1874	LCol	Executive Officer and Assistant to the Governor, RMC Sandhurst
08/1875	Colonel	Commandant Royal Military College Sandhurst
12/07/1884	Major-General	General Officer Commanding the Canadian Militia (Local Rank of MGen)
27/03/1885	Major-General	To Winnipeg – Hostages near Batoche – Set off for Qu'Appelle
06/04/1885	Major-General	Arrives Qu'Appelle
12/05/1885	Major-General	Métis scattered at Batoche – Sends Riel South for trial
22/06/1885	Major-General	Troops head for Home
25/08/1885	Major-General	Knight (KCMG) and Parliament gave him \$20,000 – Confirmed MGen
1887	Lieutenant-General	Retired List BA \ British Pension of £100 a year for distinguished service
04/1890	Lieutenant-General	Testified in Parliament over furs that had vanished
30/06/1890	Lieutenant-General	Ends command of Canadian Militia and returns to England; Retires
