QUINN, Howard Lee, Acting Lieutenant-Commander - Mention in Despatches - RCNVR / HMCS Eyebright - Awarded as per **Canada Gazette of 6 January 1945 and **London Gazette** of 1 January 1945. Home: Victoria, British Columbia.**

Joined Prince Rupert Half Company of the RCNVR from April 1925 to 1927 as an Ordinary Seaman.

He was not quite 16 years old when he joined.

Industrial designer with Neon Products Ltd before WW2 and mobilized at Stadacona for War Service in 1940. To Venture for **HMCS Collingwood** in 1941. To HMS Kings for Navigation Course in 1942. To Cornwallis for Anti-submarine Course in 1942.

To Avalon for duty with Captain (D) as Spare Commanding Officer in 1942.

Commanding Officer of HMCS Eyebright (Flower Class Corvette - K150) from 7 February 1943 to 1 September 1944.

To Givenchy for C.N.-560 in 1944.

First **Commanding Officer** of **HMCS Strathadam** (River Class Frigate - K682) from 29 September 1944 to 06 July 1945 and from 30 July 1945 to 7 November 1945. Senior Officer of the 25th Escort Group for a period of this time.

Commanding Officer of HMCS Beacon Hill (River Class Frigate - K407) from 13 September 1945 to 5 February 1946.

Commanding Officer of HMCS Grou (River Class Frigate - K518) briefly in 1946.

To Givenchy as Executive Officer Ships in Reserve in 1946.

Transferred from the RCNVR to the RCN in 1946 as LCdr.

First Commanding Officer of **HMCS Gatineau (II)** (Restigouche Class Destroyer Escort - 236) from 17 February 1959 to 14 September 1959 and Commander of the Fifth Escort Squadron.

Promoted **Commodore** in 1959 and to Hochelaga as Senior Naval Officer St. Lawrence River Area and as Naval Officer-in-Charge Montreal. Made Honorary AdC to Governor General in 1959.

To National Defence College of Canada as Naval Member of Directing Staff in 1961 and retired in 1965.

After retiring from the navy he was a marine consultant who worked in Canada and Fiji.
